## PARENT/STUDENT SCHEDULING NIGHT

How many classes will each student take?

All S-DMS students (grades 6th - 8th) will take seven academic classes. Students will also take an “advisory” period which will be a shortened class period at the end of each day.

How do I know what content is covered in each elective course?

S-DMS has compiled a short video which describes what is covered in each elective course (Art, Choir, FACS, etc) The video can be found on our school website: <http://sdms.sunmandearborn.k12.in.us/>

What is “advisory?”

Advisory is time which students can utilize to work on homework, meet with clubs, get extra help from teachers, or simply work on organizational skills.

What is the difference between a semester, full year, and 9 weeks course?

Full year courses: are classes which meet every day all year (180 days)

Semester courses: are classes which meet every day for half of the year (90 days). Semester classes run either from August through December or January through May.

9 week courses (Health & Digital Citizenship ONLY): are classes which meet every day for 9 weeks (45 days). These courses may meet 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th quarter.

Do I have to take Digital Citizenship and/or Reading?

Yes. S-DMS is committed in providing the best academic preparation for your student’s high school career. Digital Citizenship and literacy skills are both areas which are critical. Regardless of current proficiency level, all students can improve upon digital and literacy skills.

When will I receive my schedule?

Our goal is to issue all 17-18 schedules to students by May 1, 2017. At that point students will have until the last student day this school year to make any schedule changes.

Will I get into all of my elective choices?

We hope, however nothing is guaranteed. We ask that you take your alternate choices seriously, and sign up for courses you would like to take. If you do not sign up for an alternate class, and your elective choice does not work, we will select course(s) for you.

What if I get my schedule and I do not like the classes I am enrolled in?

We allow schedule changes until the last student day this school year (currently May 26, 2017). ***No schedule changes will be made after the last student day this year.***

What is Math Lab & Language Arts Lab?

S-DMS is able to provide students extra assistance in math and/or Language Arts through a lab course. Math lab and Language Arts lab will concentrate on individual student skill deficiencies. Not all students will be placed in a lab class, however, based on student data, some students will be placed into either Math or Language Arts lab.
